**Summary:**

Vault functions as the kitchen for Bojack’s, a long-running restaurant in downtown Lewiston which may have been developed outside of the historic district’s period of historic significance (from 1890-ca. 1930). The vault’s late 19<sup>th</sup> century historic integrity is extensively compromised, however, the modification of the vault to serve as Bojack’s kitchen may be approaching 50 years of age and thus eligible for consideration as a historic modification.
